- Dermatologic Surgery complication tracking initiative, WRNMMC. Developed efficient and accurate manner for staff and resident physicians to track surgical complications utilizing a secured excel spreadsheet format. This enabled more optimal care of patients and reduced patient visits to ER and outside urgent care facilities, decreasing military health care costs and enhancing patient care and satisfaction.
